The OGA CC encourages and provides keen, enjoyable and positive cricket against friendly rivals on the spectacular grounds of St George's College.

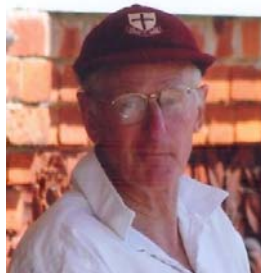
## Who can join the OGA CC?

## The History of the OGA Cricket Club



Old Georgians' have played cricket on a regular basis since 1875 with the exception of the World War One years.

Raymond Bird was the Sports' Secretary for many years and was responsible for raising teams and was the scorer of the first recorded century by an OG team.



In the early weeks of 1946, teams consisted of past students, former College staff, friends and the Josephite Community.

John Wilson organised matches for 5 successful years until 1957 when Brian O'Gorman took over the responsibility. Simon Henderson and Andrew Robson coordinated matches between 1993 and 2001.



Many of the fixtures are long standing and there are now allocated Managers responsible for organising the programme of 12 matches.



The Old Georgians are twice winners of the Cricket World Trophy – a trophy for Old Boys' Clubs.

Recent first class cricketers from St George's play for the Club when they are able to. These include Adam Hollioake (England and Surrey), Tim O'Gorman (Derbyshire) and Matt Church (Worcestershire).
